



GENERAL APPEARANCE CODE

1. PERMISSIBLE JEWELS

1.1 A small pearl or diamond earring or earring (3mm diameter); only one pair in the lower ear hole.

- Wrist watch.

- Lapel badges that indicate an achievement or involvement in a school context.

- Medical bracelets indicating an allergy.

- No tongue rings, nose rings or teeth jewelry are allowed. .

1.2. Unacceptable jewels will be taken down and stored in the vault until the end of the term in question.

1.3. Tattoos must be covered up.

2. HAIR

2.1 Hair is always neatly cut, combed and groomed.

2.2 Long hair is tied with prescribed clips, rubber bands and ribbons in red.

2.3 Quives may not hang over the eyebrows/in the face.

2.4 Hair colour is stylish and natural. If her hair is unnaturally coloured, the learner may not represent the School, attend school events, and may be asked to colour the hair "correctly" before being allowed to attend classes again.

2.5 Boys' hair must be neatly cut. (Long hair will not be tolerated).

2.6 Boys who do not comply with the hair code of the school may not participate in sports or school events under any circumstances (so-called learners may be asked to stay at home until the hair is neatly cut).

2.7 Girls' hair must be neatly combed or brushed before it is formed into a ponytail or bun.

3. NAILS

3.1 Nails must be neatly groomed and not too long.

3.2 Colourless nail polish is permissible.

3.3 No "nail art" is allowed.

3.4 No false nails or eyelashes are allowed.

3.5 Matric students may wear short neat French manicured nails.

4. MAKE-UP

4.1 No make-up is worn with the official school uniform or sports uniform.

5. DRESS DURING CIVVIE DAYS

5.1 Civvie Days are held primarily to support national charity days and deserving projects and to emphasize Cradock High School's caring value.

5.2 In exchange for the privilege of wearing informal attire, the learners and staff pay a minimal fee.

5.3 The dress code during these days supports the values of respect and well-roundedness that Cradock High School advocates.

5.4 The boys/girls are expected to be decently and appropriately dressed for school, without offending anyone with their clothing.

5.5 It must be prevented that civvie days degenerate into a fashion show with the latest fads, but the girls are given the opportunity to show something of their personal style and individuality because it is also a way in which we get to know them

5.6 General guidelines:

- Wear shoes at all times.
- Pajamas and slippers are not allowed.
- During the summer months, dresses, skirts and shorts must be of a suitable length. If learners fail to follow this arrangement, no shorts (girls) will be allowed.
- Wear clothes that are not body revealing (no open waistlines and low necklines).
- No underwear may be visible.
- Light makeup and nail polish are acceptable.
- NOTE: a rounded look compliments a boy/girl.

6 Shave (Boys)

6.1 Boys may not have sideburns.

6.2 Boys must shave every day as necessary (stubbed beards not permitted)

6.3 Boys who do not heed these rules will be sent home to shave.

6.4 Boys who may not shave for some medical reason must obtain a doctor's certificate from a dermatologist appointed by the school.

7. GENERAL

7.1 Learners who do not adhere to the above instructions will be asked to correct their appearance immediately before they can continue to attend classes.
